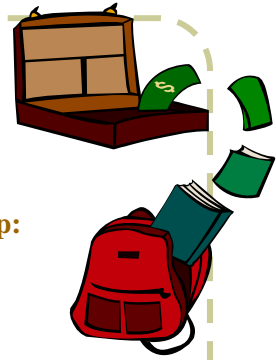
## *New Faculty Profile: Dr. Scott Carter*

Dr. J. Scott Carter will be joining us from the University of West Georgia where he was an Assistant Professor in the Sociology and Criminology Department for 3 years. Prior to that position, he earned a Ph.D. degree in Sociology at the University of South Carolina where he studied racial inequality and urban and region subcultures. Before shifting his interest to Sociology, Dr. Carter earned a bachelor degree in psychology from the University of South Carolina and a masters degree in Applied Psychology from Francis Marion University.

Dr. Carter's research interests revolve around racial and gender inequality, attitude measurement issues, and urban and region subcultures. In particular, he has been interested in understanding the unique characteristics of Southern and rural living on residents. This interest developed primarily while growing up in a highly racially integrated small town in the middle of the Old South.

While research and teaching describes his academic life, Dr. Carter is very excited about joining UCF to be nearer to the beach and the warm weather where he enjoys outdoor activities such as tennis and swimming.
